

The Institute for Peace Research and Security Policy at the University of Hamburg (IFSH) is seeking to fill a position as

The position entails 40 working hours per month and will be remunerated according to the University of Hamburg's rate for student assistants ($10,44 \in /h$). Prerequisite for the employment as student assistant are at least two completed university semesters (B.A.) in political or social science, or a related discipline.

The student assistant will support the research project "*International Police Missions: Foreign Experts in Conflict-Affected States*". The research project, which looks at multinational police assistance as part of international statebuilding missions, is funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG) and is led by Prof. Dr. Ursula Schröder and Dr. habil. Cornelius Friesendorf.¹

Your tasks include

- to support the research of the project team through literature reviews and background research in the field of peace and conflict studies, especially security sector reform and police science
- to support the preparation and writing of various publications (editing of German and English publications)
- administrative support in organisational tasks, such as workshop preparation, communication with project partners, fieldwork preparation, writing of protocols

Your profile

- interest in and knowledge of security policy, peace and conflict studies, criminology, international relations, and/or European studies
- proficient abilities in research and analysis (e.g. use of Endnote, relevant databases, literature review)
- organisational skills and ability to work in a team
- proficiency in English
