

THE PROJECT

The *Arms Control and Emerging Technologies* project was funded by the German Federal Foreign Office, initially for four years until 2022. Its goal: identifying how Germany could make cooperative approaches on arms control, non-proliferation, and disarmament more effective. The project contributed to academic and policy debates by publishing scholarly works, hosting events, and expanding national as well as international networks.

The project was favourably evaluated by a high-ranking panel. Due to its impressive research and policy output, the Federal Foreign Office decided to renew the project grant for an additional four years until 2026.

The research and transfer project *Arms Control and Emerging Technologies* is funded by the German Federal Foreign Office.

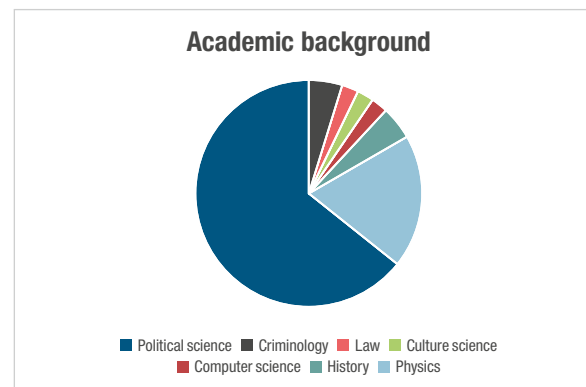
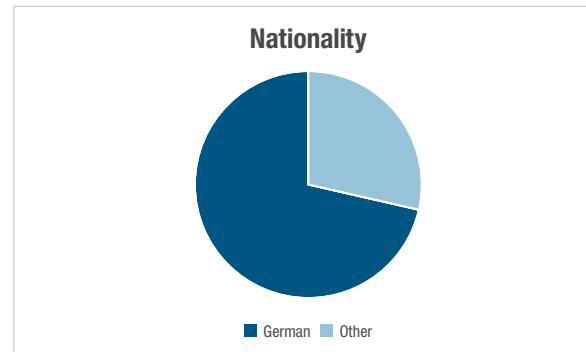
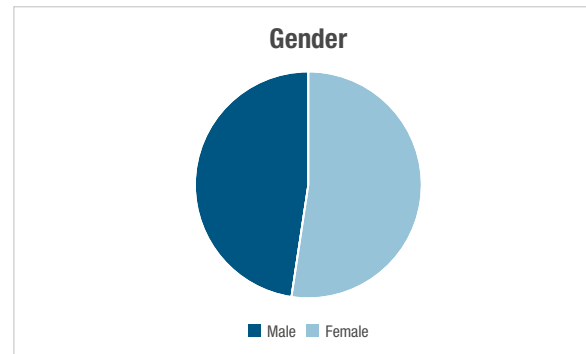

THE TEAM

Between 2019 and 2022, the *Arms Control and Emerging Technologies* team included 42 researchers and support staff. More than half of the team were women, and two thirds were under the age of 35. Constant integration of international scholars guaranteed a diverse and multinational research setting – one in three team members was not German. Researchers from different disciplines cooperated on technical and political questions of peace and security, strengthening the multi-disciplinary approach of the team. This established IFSH as one of Europe’s leading hubs on all topics relating to arms control and emerging technologies.
