Selection Process (April – May)

THE SELECTION PROCESS TAKES PLACE IN TWO STAGES:

- 1. Ranking according to documents:
 - a) Grade of higher education entrance qualification,
 - b) Grades of university degrees,
 - c) Work experience,
 - d) Letter of motivation and curriculum vitae
- 2. Further selection process for selected applicants consisting of essay and interview for final ranking.


